Training (OPT)





WHAT IS OPT?

Optional practical training (OPT) is one type of work permission available for eligible F-1 students. It allows students to get real-world work experience directly related to their field of study. You may apply for OPT during your academic program, after your program completion, or a combination of both. You are eligible for 12 months of full-time (FT) OPT per academic level and you do not need a job offer to apply.

ELIGIBILITY?

The student has been a FT student for one academic year (two semesters) in an SEVP-certified:

*College *University
*Conservatory *Seminary
The student has not exceeded 12
months of FT Curricular Practical
Training (CPT) authorization.
The student has not used OPT at
their current academic level.

WHEN TO APPLY?

You do not need a job offer to apply. We suggest you apply three months from the date you wish to start working. OPT is recommended by DSOs, but final approval is granted by USCIS. USCIS issues the approved OPT with an Employment Authorization Document/Card (EAD) which typically takes approximately 90 days to process.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Instructions for I-765 Form

2. You will need to include with the I-765 form the following:

*A copy of your Form I-94 *Two identical passport-style photographs *Copies of all your I-20's *Copy of your Visa *Copy of your Passport *Fee of \$410.00 *New I-20 with OPT request on it.

3. Please go see the international offices once you have all the paperwork completed above.

DEADLINES TO KNOW?

- 9 months = Been enrolled and in F-1 status prior to applying.
- 90 days before completion date = Earliest to apply for post-completion OPT.
- 60 days after completion date
 Latest to apply for postcompletion OPT.
- 30 days = Between receiving OPT recommendation from the Designated School Official (DSO) with signature on the I-20 and sending to and be received by USCIS.
- 90 days = Typical processing time of OPT approval (EAD) by USCIS.
